

Each plant comes in a Six-cell pack for \$3 ea.

Celosia or Amish Cockscomb (ca. 1570) Beautiful large red heads (up to 10 inches across) on compact 1-foot-tall plant. Annual introduced to Europe in the 1570s. Thought lost but discovered in an Amish garden in Arthur, Ill. Blooms all summer. Great cut flowers. Grows to 12 inches. Full sun.

Bunny Tails or Hare's Tail Grass Annual Ornamental grass with cream-colored bloom. Fun and easy plant to grow. Drought tolerant. Blooms late spring through mid-summer. Reseeds itself. Flowers good for drying. Good container plant. Grows 12–18 inches. Full sun.

Joseph's Coat (ca. 1786) Vibrant yellow and red foliage. Provides eye-catching color in summer. Jefferson sent seeds from Paris to his brother-in-law as early as 1786. This brightly plumed tender annual grows to 4 feet. Prefers a warm, sunny exposure.

Love-In-A-Mist (ca. 1570) Lilac pink flowers amid delicate, lacy foliage. Hardy 12-inch-high annual cultivated since the late 16th century. Originally from 300 B.C. Greece. Plants prefer full sun to light shade. Seed capsules are popular in dried arrangements. Great cut flowers. Flowers before mid-summer.

Nasturtium — Alaska Mix Plants come in a wide array of colors including reds, salmons, oranges and yellows. Flowers edible with variegated foliage. Seeds can be used as substitute for capers. Plants grow approximately 12 inches high and spread to 18 inches. Blooms all summer. Prefers full sun. Easy to grow.

Painted Tongue Mixed colors with petunia like flowers. Great container plants and garden fillers. The flowers, shaped like petunias, are painted with variegated stripes of color from yellows to purples. Annuals bloom early summer to fall. Deadheading recommended for maximum blooms. Plant grows 12–24 inches high with flowers around 2 inches across. Best in full sun.

Historic Pansies From the 1800s, these multi-colored flowers grow 6–8 inches high. The biennial self-seeder blooms from mid-summer to fall. Best in sun.

Heirloom Snapdragons A multicolor hardy annual. Grows 2–3 feet high in full sun or partial shade. Originally snapdragons were found growing wild in Spain. Prefers a rich, well-drained soil that is not too dry. Will tolerate hot weather given time to develop a good root system.

The Ohio Historical Center is located just off I-71 on 17th Avenue (exit 111) about four miles north of downtown Columbus in Franklin County.

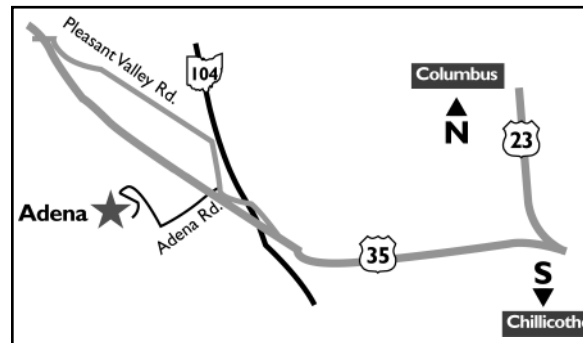
