# STEPS FOR WRITING THE NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION

# Refer to the NPS Bulletin: How to Complete the National Register Registration Form for more detailed instructions

#### I. INTRODUCTORY PARAGRAPH

- A. Summarize the building
  - 1. What is the date of construction
  - 2. what is its basic shape and size
  - 3. what is its architectural style or building type
- B. Summarize the setting
  - 1. is it within a community or in a rural location
  - 2. what is the landscaping of the property like
  - 3. are there other buildings/structures on the property

#### II. EXTERIOR DESCRIPTION

- A. Describe the primary elevation
  - 1. how many doors and windows are there & how they are arranged
  - 2. how is the main facade oriented on the property
  - 3. what are the unique architectural features
  - 4. what alterations have been made and when were they done
- B. Describe the secondary elevations as outlined above

### III. INTERIOR DESCRIPTION

- A. Describe the floorplan
  - 1. have any significant changes occurred and when were they done
  - 2. are the original details intact (fireplaces, door/window trim, cabinets, etc.)

# IV. SETTING

- A. If the property is complex, describe the landscape in further detail enhancing what was noted in the introductory paragraph
- B. Provide some description for the other buildings and/or structures on the property
  - 1. when were they constructed
  - 2. are they contributing or noncontributing (corresponds with Section 5 of the form)

# V. SUMMARY

A. Briefly conclude by evaluating the property's integrity. What are the important physical characteristics that illustrate the property's historic significance?

- 1. Every detail does not have to be described.
- 2. Relate the written text to nomination photographs. Put photo numbers next to any points to be illustrated within the narrative.
- 3. The narrative should be written from the general to the specific.
