Raised in Poindexter Village, Aminah Robinson became one of the most well-known folk artists in the country and was a recipient of a MacArthur Foundation Genius Grant. She combined traditional art materials with found objects such as buttons, cloth, leather, twigs and shells. She created two- and three-dimensional works of art, including large multimedia works she called “RagGonNons.” Her legacy also includes paintings, drawings, prints, button-beaded dolls, handmade books and illustrated journals. She also published children’s books grounded in African American ancestral legacies. This signed and framed color print by Aminah celebrates 50 years of The Columbus Foundation’s community work from 1943 to 1993.
