It has been another outstanding year for Ohio History. We embarked on our new strategic plan, the *Initiative for Ohio History*, which allows us to reach wider audiences and extend our services all over the state. Already we have accomplished so much in the first year of our strategic plan:

- We commemorated the 50th anniversary of the National Historic Preservation Act, which has been instrumental in preserving the historic fabric of communities, towns and cities all over our state.

Throughout Glenda's nine years as trustee and four years as president, she has been a tireless champion for Ohio History all across the state, literally driving thousands of miles on behalf of Ohio History. Our partners at our historic sites work daily to share stories of the significant people and places in Ohio History in relevant and engaging ways. At the Rankin House in Ripley you learn of Eliza, the runaway slave who crossed a frigid Ohio River to find refuge and safety at John Rankin's home. Eliza inspired a story in Harriet Beecher Stowe's novel *Uncle Tom's Cabin* and helped illustrate the antislavery movement in Ohio. At Newark Earthworks you learn of the ancient native people who crafted the largest and most spectacular geometric earthworks in the world, inspiring awe in the expertise of our first inhabitants and their place in Ohio's story.


I'm eager to help share the stories of these important places, support the work of our historic site partners and continue to help them build a foundation for an appreciation of Ohio History among future generations.

The *Initiative for Ohio History*, our strategic plan, is focused on sharing and providing access to Ohio's amazing stories. We want to put history in the hands of all Ohioans because we believe that the voices of Ohioans are the most important foundation of the *Initiative for Ohio History*. To hear from people all over the state, we hit the road for our *Dear Ohio Tour*. We're visiting all 88 counties in Ohio over the next few years to capture stories and find out what makes each county special.

## DEAR OHIO, PHASE 1

In summer 2016, the first phase, we've visited festivals, baseball games and fairs in 20 counties.

The *Dear Ohio Tour* gives us an opportunity to strengthen and build relationships in each county; capture Ohio's stories and identifying characteristics; and build awareness and support for the *Initiative for Ohio History*.

In phase 1 of the *Dear Ohio Tour* we've,

- Engaged with over 1,750 people.
  - Collected 163 stories and anecdotes about living in Ohio.




# Annual Revenue + Expenses






