PRESERVING OUR PAST, PROTECTING OUR FUTURE

Zoar, Tuscarawas County

The Zoar Levee required urgent repairs after high-water events in the early 2000s exposed its structural deficiencies, threatening the National Historic Landmark (NHL) of Zoar. Working with consulting parties, including American Indian Tribes, the National Trust for Historic Preservation, and the National Park Service, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), Huntington District, developed a repair plan that safeguarded the village without adversely affecting the NHL. Continuous consultation allowed Zoar to remain open during construction and host events without disruption. This project demonstrated how effective Section 106 consultation ensures both mission success and historic preservation.
